

# PLANTS FOR SALE

## Hardy perennials

<b>ACHILLEA MILLEFOLIUM 'LILAC BEAUTY'</b>	mat-forming perennial, to 80cm tall, with ferny, green basal leaves and stems that carry flat-topped flowerheads of lilac-purple freely borne but fading with age
<b>ACONITUM EX 'STAINLESS STEEL'</b>	a striking cultivar with almost grey flowers rather than the blues usual to this genus; the flowers are cream internally; flowering late spring
<b>AQUILEGIA EX 'BLACK BARLOW'</b>	90cm tall, with grey-green divided leaves and distinctive, pompon-like, deep purple flowers in early spring and summer; comes true from seed
<b>ASPHODELINE LIBURNICA</b>	upright, clump-forming perennial with bluish-green narrow leaves and spikes of pale yellow star-shaped flowers to 5cm across with green stripes on the back of each petal
<b>ASTILBE x ARENDSII 'AMETHYST'</b>	magnificent astilbe; 4-5' lilac plumes in July-August; dark green, divided foliage with dark red stems; must have damp
<b>ASTILBE x ARENDSII 'BRESSINGHAM BEAUTY'</b>	tall cultivar with bronze-flushed mid-green leaves and plumes of bright pink flowers in midsummer; must have damp
<b>ASTILBE x ARENDSII 'FANAL'</b>	early flowering, dark red plumes in June-July; must have damp
<b>ASTILBOIDES TABULARIS</b>	very large, rounded, lobed leaves attached to the stalk near the middle, and dense panicles of small cream flowers on erect stalks above the foliage in early summer; prefers shade and, as with all large-leaved plants, likes moisture
<b>BRUNNERA MACROPHYLLA 'JACK FROST'</b>	large, heart-shaped silver leaves edged and veined with green, and sprays of small blue flowers in spring
<b>CALAMAGROSTIS 'AVALANCHE'</b>	Feather Reed Grass, clump forming perennial with arching pale yellow leaves, fading to pinkish white, with green margins and stripes
<b>CANNA 'CANNOVA ROSE'</b>	up to 1.5m tall, rose-red flowers; treat overwinter like dahlias but start into growth early for mid-summer flowering
<b>CANNA 'RICHARD WALLACE'</b>	1.2m tall, with large, mid-green leaves and rich yellow flowers, from mid-summer to mid-autumn
<b>CANNA 'WYOMING'</b>	up to 2m tall, orange flowers with reddish purple foliage; treat overwinter like dahlias but start into growth early for mid-summer flowering
<b>CANNA 'YARA'</b>	80 cm tall, with large, mid-green leaves and rich yellow flowers speckled with red, from mid-summer to mid-autumn; we got 15 flowering stems from one rhizome one year!
<b>CAREX MORROWII VARIEGATA</b>	a Japanese sedge that produces narrow long striped evergreen leaves. A great low border or groundcover, or just in pots or rock gardens
<b>CHRYSANTHEMUM</b>	the white, spidery form beloved by florists; quite hardy
<b>CRINUM x POWELLII</b>	Protection of a south-facing wall will ensure a late summer display of scented, pinkish white trumpets; plant with the neck of the bulbs exposed and mulch with a heap of leaves over winter
<b>DIANELLA TASMANICA</b>	1.2m tall, with tough, grass-like leaves and branched panicles of tiny violet-blue flowers 2cm wide, with prominent yellow stamens, followed by glossy violet-blue berries
<b>GERANIUM MACRORRHYZUM 'BEVAN'S VARIETY'</b>	strong-growing semi-evergreen perennial forming a wide mat of aromatic, rounded leaves, with deep purplish-pink flowers in May; excellent groundcover
<b>GERANIUM 'ROZANNE'</b>	A vigorous spreading perennial to 60cm tall, with neat, dense, lobed, marbled and flecked mid-green leaves and saucer-shaped violet-blue flowers 5cm wide, veined purple, with a white centre, opening from early summer to early autumn; voted Chelsea Plant of the Centenary for the decade 1993-2002
<b>GILLENIA TRIFOLIATA</b>	reddish stems bearing small, 3-lobed leaves and open sprays of starry white flowers 3-4cm in width, with contrasting red calyces; elegant foliage
<b>HEUCHERA 'CAFÉ AU LAIT'</b>	beautiful frilly leaves of glossy dark chocolate, covered in white flowers in spring. Makes a beautiful, neat plant very tight and compact
<b>HOSTA 'FRANCES WILLIAMS'</b>	broadly heart-shaped, puckered and veined grey-green leaves to 30cm, with a wide, irregular yellow-green margins
<b>HOSTA 'HALCYON'</b>	compact perennial with ovate, thick-textured, vivid blue-grey leaves to 20cm in length. Light greyish-lavender, bell-shaped flowers are carried on stems to 40cm
<b>HOSTA PLANTAGINEA</b>	forms a large dome-shaped mound, to 60cm high, with mid-green, glossy leaves and white flowers, very fragrant at night and borne on stems to 80cm, from late summer to autumn
<b>HOSTA 'REGAL SPLENDOUR'</b>	urn-shaped mound of wavy-edged grey-green leaves, each of which is framed with an irregular yellowish margin that becomes creamier over time

<b>HOSTA 'TWIST OF LIME'</b>	Vigorous dwarf hosta with golden leaves and wavy dark green margins; dark purple flowers appear on upright stems
<b>HOSTA 'WIDE BRIM'</b>	clump-forming with broadly heart-shaped, puckered dark green-blue leaves broadly-margined with creamy-yellow. Funnel-shaped pale lavender flowers on stems to 60cm in summer
<b>HYDRANGEA MACROPHYLLA 'MADAME EMILE MOUILLÈRE'</b>	Wonderful, white flowers from July to August, becoming pink-tinged with age, and coarsely toothed, dark green leaves.
<b>KNIPHOFIA 'BEES LEMON'</b>	90cm tall with narrow, arching green foliage; yellow flowers open from lime green buds over several weeks in mid to late summer
<b>LIGULARIA 'ZEPTER'</b>	a vigorous, clump-forming, bushy, perennial with rounded to heart-shaped, toothed, dark green leaves and erect, purple-black stems bearing spikes of yellow-orange flowers in summer
<b>LYSIMACHIA CLETHROIDES</b>	otherwise known as the goose-necked loosestrife, this notoriously invasive plant nevertheless always attracts attention
<b>OPHIOPOGON PLANISCAPUS 'NIGRESCENS'</b>	clump-forming evergreen perennial has strappy, inky purple, grass-like leaves. In summer, small spikes of bell-shaped, pale mauve flowers appear, followed by spherical, dark blue fruit
<b>PHLOMIS RUSSELIANA</b>	90cm in height, with large, ovate, rough-textured grey-green leaves. Stout stems bear whorls of hooded, soft yellow flowers 3cm in length; clumps up rapidly
<b>PHLOMIS TUBEROSA</b>	purplish stems carrying deeply veined and sharply serrated, dark green arrow-shaped leaves; clusters of purple or pink flowers appear in summer
<b>PHLOX PANICULATA 'UTOPIA'</b>	1.5m high, with green, lance-shaped leaves and very large heads of highly-scented, pale lilac-pink flowers in mid and late summer; my favourite phlox!
<b>PODOPHYLLUM VERSIPELLE 'SPOTTY DOTTY'</b>	A show-stopper of a foliage plant for the shade; always attracts attention; curious dark red flowers form in early spring under the expanding leaves, so are easily missed; grown for its foliage
<b>PRIMULA, CANDELABRA TYPE</b>	leaves in basal rosettes, and flowerheads with layered whorls of flowers in shades of pink, red, purple, yellow, orange, or white in late spring and early summer
<b>RUDBECKIA FULGIDA var. DEAMII</b>	clump-forming, erect perennial to 60cm, with oval, dark green, roughly hairy leaves and black-eyed bright yellow daisies to 7cm in width from late summer to mid-autumn
<b>RUDBECKIA LACINIATA 'HERBSTSONNE'</b>	Clump-forming, erect perennial to 200cm; black-eyed bright yellow daisies to 10 cm in width from late summer to mid-autumn; perfect for the back of the border.
<b>SANGUISORBA HAKUSINENSIS 'LILAC SQUIRREL'</b>	So different from most of its kind; spectacular foliage and dangling lilac tassels from mid-summer instead of the usually-found dull red drumstick style flowers common to the genus; worth staking.
<b>SILENE FIMBRIATA</b>	a stunning species from the campion family; clusters of single, white flowers with frilly petals and chunky, fresh green calyx, on tall stems above mounds of green foliage. Happy in sun or shade, but is less spreading when grown in a dry, sunny spot.
<b>TRADESCANTIA 'CONCORD GRAPE'</b>	clump-forming perennial to 35cm tall, with narrowly lance-shaped blue-green leaves and branched stems bearing clusters of bright purple flowers 3-4cm wide in summer and early autumn
<b>TRADESCANTIA FLUMINENSIS 'MAIDEN'S BLUSH'</b>	trailing perennial with lance-shaped leaves that emerge pink, becoming green; small white flowers open sporadically through the year
<b>VERONICASTRUM 'FASCINATION'</b>	Tall, clump-forming perennial with pale mauve spires; beloved by bees and free from mildew

## **House/Conservatory plants**

<b>AMARYLLIS PAPILIO</b>	a robust species producing abundant leafy growth. Flowers are borne 2 or 3 to a stem, to 50cm tall, and have distinctive colouring, the greenish-white tepals strongly streaked and edged with dark red. The lower pair of tepals, widely spread and pointed, suggesting the "butterfly" specific name; cut straggly leaves off in late May and grow on outdoors until October
<b>CLIVIA MINIATA</b>	bold strap-shaped, dark-green leaves and trumpet-shaped orange flowers borne in groups on stout stems; popular houseplant
<b>SPATHYPHYLLUM WALLISII</b>	the Peace Lily; popular houseplant
<b>VELTHEIMIA CAPENSIS</b>	bulbous South African perennial to 45cm, with a rosette of strap-shaped, wavy-edged, glaucous leaves and stout, purple-spotted stems bearing a terminal raceme of drooping tubular pale pink flowers 3-4cm in length, with darker spots
